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7.12 Addition:

Insert the following note at the end of this subclause:

NOTE Additional requirements for the marking at appliance outlets apply (USA).

Insert the following text:

7.12.6 Addition:

The instructions shall contain explanations of pictograms present on the appliance.

Insert the following new subclause:

7.101 Appliance outlets shall be marked as follows:

“When connecting attachments read and observe the instructions for use”.

A suitable pictogram may be provided instead of the text. The meaning of the pictogram shall be explained in the instructions for use.

Insert the following text:

8.1.4 *Add after the last paragraph:*

Isolated battery systems of 18 to 24 cells of either acid or alkaline electrochemistry, including gel batteries, shall be regarded as **Class III** provided that

- the maximum voltage per cell on charge does not exceed 2,7 V;
- there are no **earthed parts** (see clause 27);
- conductive parts cannot fall on to and thereby bridge **live parts** of opposite polarity (see clause 22).
